(Note: Ask yourself these three questions, too!)

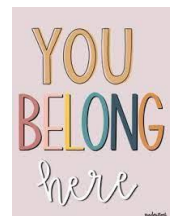

KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION 2023

January 23-27, 2023 will be Kindergarten Registration for MONTESSORI as a SCHOOL OF CHOICE OPTION. This is a LOTTERY registration so consider the registration process your Expression of Interest into having your child in the Montessori Program.

NEIGHBOURHOOD Kindergarten Registration starts February 6-February 10, 2023.

Please bring your child's birth certificate and BC Services Card to the office with proof of address and fill out an Enrollment Form as well as a District Form if you have a child that has any significant social, cognitive or medical difficulties. Only students from our catchment area may be accepted at this time and parents need to prove they live in our catchment area to attend. Students from another neighborhood must register at their catchment area school, complete an "APPLICATION FOR ELEMENTARY STUDENT TRANSFER TO ANOTHER SCHOOL" form and bring that to Aberdeen Elementary during the official Kindergarten registration time. Out of catchment students would be put on a waitlist and notified in September if there is room at our school. PLEASE NOTE THAT ADMISSION TO OUR SCHOOL IS DONE BY A LOTTERY SYSTEM at the SCHOOL BOARD OFFICE for MONTESSORI PROGRAM. Our school has limited spots available each registration period.

PLEASE NOTE: Families registering for Kindergarten are encouraged to attend the KINDERGARTEN ROUND UP EVENT on February 2, 2023. This a virtual session via Zoom. Zoom link will be publicized by District.

ALSO, On Wednesday January 11th there is an INFORMATION NIGHT regarding SCHOOLS OF CHOICE at 6:30 pm-7:30 pm. This is a virtual event. The district will send out the Zoom link as it gets closer to the event.



OUR WELCOME TO KINDERGARTEN EVENT THIS YEAR is called **SPARK** (Strong, Prepared, and Ready for Kindergarten) Parents will be asked to come to four sessions on four different Tuesdays. The first three sessions are parent and child participation, and the final session is just for our parents to find out more about our school.

VERY IMPORTANT CHANGE: CRIMINAL RECORD CHECKS

Effective immediately, ALL PARENTS/GRANDPARENTS/ADULTS that are going on ANY trip with your class, are driving as volunteers or are coming support with class special events must have a CRIMINAL RECORD CHECK. **PLEASE KNOW THIS IS A DISTRICT DECISION not a Principal decision.** All schools will be transitioning to this practice. This is posted on our website as well under Volunteer/Get Involved for how to complete a Criminal Record Check and I have put the document below with the access code for our school. I would suggest that ANY parents that want to be considered to help us please get this in place immediately. We need all parents that will be driving to basketball games or helping with Choice Days need this in place prior to January 2023. An adult cannot attend or come into the classroom until Stacey Flynn receives your cleared Criminal Record Check. Please know your check is in place for three years and is of no cost to parents.

Just a reminder to all students and parents that SD73 has an elementary sports code of conduct. All basketball players and parents will be required to review and sign the [Elementary Student-Athlete Expectations](#) form acknowledging their commitment to honoring the expectations in order to participate. A copy of the form will go home with the permission forms at the beginning of January. Thank you for your support.

Students who are playing on our teams will be invited every day at recess to our SHOOTING PRACTICE supervised by a variety of staff members. Mrs. DeFehr has created the schedule so that our athletes get daily practice to work on their technique. Due to the number of children playing we will alternate Girls and Boys each day.

CHOICE DAYS

A huge thank you to staff and parent volunteers who have helped to create a schedule to give CHOICES to kids this winter! During the winter months many children enjoy the outside and winter weather. Heading outside is always the #1 preferred activity for children so that they get fresh air and exercise. However, with the cold weather, we have many children that do not enjoy the outside so we are offering some choices for children, supervised by our staff and parents from January to March!

Teachers will have Passes for the options provided and will rotate if needed in who they give the pass to in each division.

Please see the schedule at the back of the newsletter so that you can talk to your children about these options.

INSIDE SHOES

We kindly ask that you send your child with a pair of comfortable inside shoes. With the winter weather, all staff and students remove their outside footwear at the entrances.

Children should not be in sock feet in our building. This poses a risk for slip and fall injuries and in the event of an emergency your child will not be prepared for a fire drill or evacuation to Pac Way Elementary.

REMINDER: REPORT CARDS

REPORT CARDS will BE UPLOADED TO MYEDBC PARENT PORTAL for parents to access on THURSDAY FEB. 2, 2023. A paper copy WILL NOT be coming home. Parents can view the report card by logging into their MYEDBC Parent Portal.

A four-point provincial proficiency scale will be used to communicate student progress in all areas of learning. It describes levels of proficiency in relation to the learning standards of the provincial curricula.

EMERGING: The student demonstrates an initial understanding of the concepts and competencies relevant to the expected learning.

DEVELOPING: The student demonstrates a partial understanding of the concepts and competencies relevant to the expected learning.

PROFICIENT: The student demonstrates a complete understanding of the concepts and competencies relevant to the expected learning.

EXTENDING: The student demonstrates a sophisticated understanding of the concepts and competencies relevant to the expected learning.

For 2023: Students at Aberdeen Elementary in Grades 4, and 7 will complete the survey. All Parents/Guardians K-7 are being given the opportunity to complete the survey; and all Staff associated with a School can complete the survey. Students will use their PEN numbers when logging in, staff and parents have direct access with no codes needed to complete the survey. Please use the DIRECT ACCESS log in (right hand side).

To complete the survey:

1. Go to any computer that has an up-to-date internet browser access at home or work. Go to http://www.bced.gov.bc.ca/sat_survey/access.htm You can also enter through our school website under the PARENT/STUDENTS/ SUPPORT HELP TOP TAB and then in the 'drop down' menu select MINISTRY STUDENT LEARNING SURVEY.
2. Find our district and school name and language you prefer.
3. Complete the survey by clicking on the 'radio buttons' for each question. Move to the next set of questions by clicking on NEXT in the bottom right corner of the screen.
4. When you are finished the survey, you will get a message "Thank you for sharing your views."
5. Once complete, our school will have the results immediately. Your views are completely anonymous, but very helpful in planning for our school.

KACZUR's KORNER

What does it mean to belong?

Walk down the hallways of Aberdeen and you will see students and staff showing hearts with their hands, creating "you belong here" hashtags with their fingers, and waving on Wednesdays. You may wonder, what does all this really mean?

At Aberdeen, we know humans are wired for connection. Dr. Martin Brokenleg notes, *"Belonging is so important that unless children have a genuine sense of it, their ability to engage in learning activities and pro-social behaviour will be impaired."*

So along with these catchy actions, there are some deep inquiries happening in our classrooms. What **DOES** it mean to belong? What big and small things can we do as a **community** to foster a sense of belonging? How can **I** show up each day with an intention of fostering a sense of belonging for myself and others?

Under the leadership of Ms. Woodley, Montessori grade 4,5,6 teacher, the staff considered this definition of belonging, *"the extent to which children feel individually welcomed, respected, included, and supported by others within the school social environment."* - Goodenow and Grady (1993)

Mr. Michel, our Aboriginal Education Worker, described belonging as being part of a family. Here it could be your classroom family or Aberdeen family. Having that connection strengthens your pride of where you are. He noted that knowing and understanding your ancestral beliefs gives you that sense of belonging to something special. There is a comfortable feeling when you are with your community; having that trust, being accepted and not just showing you care but also *giving* care to others. Be yourself!

January is often a time for reflection and intention setting. I invite you to have a family conversation.

- *What does it mean to BELONG?*
- *What communities do I feel I belong in (ie. family, friends, school, community groups, cultural groups, etc)*
- *How can I show up each day with an intention of fostering a sense of belonging for myself and others?*
- *How can I be someone that kids want to play with/hang out with?*

"Diversity is a fact. Inclusion is an action. Equity is a choice. Belonging is an outcome."

SAFE ARRIVAL

Aberdeen Elementary uses an automated SAFE ARRIVAL SYSTEM called SCHOOL MESSENGER. The system handles parent contact (including phone calls) when a student absence is unexpected, and will allow parents to interact directly with the system in a variety of ways:

- by phone either when the system calls, or when a parent initiates a call to notify of upcoming absence - by internet through login controlled webpage interface
- by smartphone app (iOS and Android versions available for free)

Parents use the above methods to report student absences rather than phoning the school at Aberdeen. **We ask that parents please report student absences before 8:20 am on the day of the absence**, although the system also allows for reporting of student absences long in advance for holidays, trips, etc. For tech-savvy parents, we encourage you to download the iOS or Android apps for free from their respective app stores. To find the app, search for SCHOOL MESSENGER and install the free app.

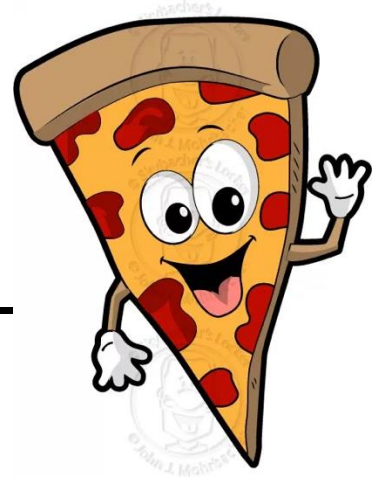
