

ABORIGINAL EDUCATION

As a part of SD73's new District Strategic Plan and our commitment to Truth & Reconciliation, we are using the Seven Grandfather Teachings as part of Social Emotional Learning here at Aberdeen. Acknowledging all of the seven teachings is important to find balance in our lives moving forward. We will be learning about all the seven teachings over the course of the year.



The focus of our learning for the months of September and October has been respect, which is represented by the salmon. Students have participated in various activities centered around the teaching of respect and the salmon including: artwork projects; identifying what respect looks like, sounds like and feels like at Aberdeen; and attending the Salute to the Sockeye Salmon at Tsútswecw Park on October 17th which allowed us to experience and interpret the local environment and learn First Peoples perspectives and knowledge about the salmon.

Students can also choose to wear their Aberedeen Spirit Wear or their usual clothes. Masks, weapons and those that are to hard to play in or go to the bathroom in should be avoided. Please ensure all costumes are culturally sensitive and respectful of diversity in our community. Direction for October 31st will come from your classroom teacher based on the learning happening on this day.

So...Halloween happens on a Monday – now I need your help for Tuesday, Nov. 1. I am asking as the principal that parents ensure that MINIMAL if not, ZERO candy comes to school the following week and beyond. Large quantities of candy, in large quantities of children really do affect the learning environment and tone of the school. Please send your normal healthy lunches, keeping in mind that candy is not part of the healthy food guide and should not be in your child's lunch.

They can eat their Halloween candy when they get home afterschool under your supervision. It is also important because we have multiple students that have severe nut allergies of all kinds and Halloween candy generally is not nut free. This poses a huge risk to those students with allergies and I would rather our kids were not put in harms way because someone wants to bring inappropriate candy. Please help the staff and I by just keeping all candy out of lunch kits. Please review with your intermediate student who may potentially make their own lunch and think Halloween candy is acceptable.

GROWTH MINDSET- TURN WORRY INTO WONDER!

Imagine this...the big volleyball game is tomorrow and your child is VERY nervous.

You watch them pacing back and forth in the kitchen pretending to bump a ball into the air...

They say, "I can't mess up this game."

Then suddenly they start complaining about a tummy ache.

"Wow," you think. "They are really worried about this game. I wish I could help..."

It's normal for children to worry. But when the worries start to overwhelm them or **cause physical symptoms**, it can be more of a problem.

We can help our children break the cycle of worry by coaching them to turn their worries into wonders:

WORRY: "I'm worried that no one at school will like me."


WONDER: "I wonder if other children at school will like playing the games I like."

WORRY: "I'm so nervous about the game."

WONDER: "I wonder if I can improve compared to my last result."

This simple switch can make a huge difference! While worries can reinforce the cycle of anxiety and produce MORE worries, wonders help interrupt that cycle of worry.

It puts a whole new spin on your child's mindset.



OUTDOOR CLASSROOM EXPERIENCES

Outdoor Classroom Day is November 3!

We are encouraging all teachers to take learning outside this day if possible. Outdoor Classroom Day is a global movement to make time outdoors part of every child's day.

The following 4 tips were shared with our staff:

- 1. Take at least one class outdoors on the day. Check out the <u>resources section of our website</u> for plenty of outdoor learning and play ideas including a selection from our friends over at <u>Earth Cubs</u>.
 - **2. Play around with playtime.** Outdoor play is critical to children's health and wellbeing. Try out some of these top tips from OPAL on Outdoor Classroom Day and witness the impact better playtimes can have for everyone.
 - **3. Set children an outdoor task to do at home.** If any of your students are learning from home on the day, share outdoor learning and play ideas with parents. From <u>mud play</u> to <u>dressing up in nature</u>, there are lots of easy ideas in our <u>resources section</u>.
 - **4. Use the journey to and from school to explore nature.** From collecting natural items to playing a game of outdoor bingo, there are lots of ideas on our <u>outdoor journeys Pinterest board</u>.

ANTI IDLING

We kindly ask for the safety of our children that at NO TIME do parents/caregivers leave their cars idling around our school perimeter. This is a district initiative where you will see signs on fences around the school. Our young lungs deserve not to inhale your car exhaust so please turn off your vehicle as you park at the school. I know in winter this is tempting to leave your car running, but in all seasons we ask that you honor this request. Mrs. DeFehr has requested more signs to be put up in drop off areas. Also, please be courteous to our neighbours around Aberdeen. I have already been fielding many complaints from neighbours about how some of our parents are parking.

NO DOGS ON SCHOOL GROUNDS

As per City of Kamloops BYLAW 34-42 (Division 7) Dog Responsibility and Control – no dogs are permitted in public schools. This is on our school grounds or inside our building. The school district also enforces that dogs are kept away from our children as well with signs at our entrances reminding community and parents not to bring dogs on our site. Please keep dogs outside of the school perimeter fencing and never on the upper hardcourt areas, playground, near the portables or the fields. More signs have been requested. Thank you for helping us out with this.

NEWSLETTERS

At the start of every month a newsletter is emailed home to parents. Be sure to check your inbox! THIS IS CRUCIAL. Ms. Crawford and I will be working to get the website current again. Each week the Parent Weekly update will be posted to the website when it comes out.

SAFE ARRIVAL

Aberdeen Elementary uses an automated SAFE ARRIVAL SYSTEM called SCHOOL MESSENGER. The system handles parent contact (including phone calls) when a student absence is unexpected, and will allow parents to interact directly with the system in a variety of ways:

- by phone either when the system calls, or when a parent initiates a call to notify of upcoming absence by internet through login controlled webpage interface
- by smartphone app (iOS and Android versions available for free)

Parents use the above methods to report student absences rather than phoning the school at Aberdeen. **We ask that parents please report student absences before 8:20 am on the day of the absence**, although the system also allows for reporting of student absences long in advance for holidays, trips, etc. For tech-savvy parents, we encourage you to download the iOS or Android apps for free from their respective app stores. To find the app, search for SCHOOL MESSENGER and install the free app.

Please always be sure to inform the teacher of your child's absence as well so that they are aware of any sickness or trips planned and to plan for instruction missed.

SUBSCRIBE TO OUR WEBSITE FOR TIMELY UPDATES!

Parents should go to the website and SUBSCRIBE to receive timely updates. Please search Aberdeen Elementary, go to the SCHOOL NEWS top tab and then on the righthand side is the SUBSCRIBE BUTTON. It will prompt you for further information and then you need to confirm via your email.

SD73, our staff, and our schools are committed to communicating with parents in as many ways as possible. We want you to know what is happening in regards to the education of your children!

Our mobile app is our latest tool. Once downloaded to your Apple or Android smartphone or tablet, the app will allow you to choose to receive news about your school straight to your device, and allow us the opportunity to reach out to you when we have important news to share.

REGISTER FOR KEV SCHOOL CASH

Our School District has engaged the services of KEV Group, a company offering a web-based software solution, *SchoolCash Online* which includes several modules designed to meet the financial needs of K-12 public education schools. With Ministerial mandates for improvement and recommendations from our external auditors, School District No. 73 is looking to using a digital product, to manage our school fees and accounting. The intention is to replace/reduce the use of cash and the use of the historic accounting system in our schools.

As a result, the School District's Finance Department and schools have been working with *SchoolCash Online* to implement a digital system connecting parents and students. This system provides an easy method of paying your child's school fees for courses, field trips, sports teams, clubs and many other student activities anytime, anywhere in a safe and secure web-based environment.

While recognizing the benefits of this payment environment, you must also be aware of the potential impacts and risks of sharing digital information online and of the necessity to protect our students' personal information regardless of where it is stored or accessed. As a public body, we are subject to the *BC Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act*. In accordance with this Act, we must at all time protect the privacy of students under our care.

We hope that you will see value in this fee payment tool for you and your child. If you choose to participate please complete the Electronic Registration Process through sd73.SchoolCashOnline.com. Your student's school administration will then provide further instructions on how to access the new system.
